Dear Dr. Coe:

In our last conversation about the transfer of the Mitchell Cemetery, I told you that the preliminary digging will take place on February the 8th and that the final excavation, transfer of remains, and reburial in the Old Chapel Hill Cemetery will take place on February 9th.

We shall appreciate very much if you will be available on the 8th in order to assist Mr. Horney of the Buildings Department, or his representative, in removing the top part of the ground to a certain depth to be determined by you. Mr. Horney will get in touch with you when he is ready to start the excavation.

When the transfer of whatever is left in the graves takes place on the 9th, it is my understanding that you and two of your graduate students will supervise this operation.

I am enclosing a plan which shows the relocation of the graves in the Old Chapel Hill Cemetery. It is planned to place the names of each - Arare child in relation to his inscription on the monument.
